Speedwatch – 2 session have been held since the last meeting including the county wide speedwatch Saturday. The SAM2 has returned to Norwich Road in Horstead. When it was there at the start of the year it recorded around 110,000 vehicle movements over 4 week period (and the same again over the 4 weeks it was facing the opposite way). The average speeds recorded in each direction was well over the 30 mph limit. We are interested to see the impact of the Broadland Northway being fully open as the perception is that traffic flow has increased.

News from Broadland District Council.

June 2018

When Council last met in April we were presented with the latest 'Crime profile overview' from Chief Inspector Hornigold. The constabulary currently have 103 Sergeants and 511 PC's, and in the last six months Safeguarding and Public Safety crimes have risen exponentially in our region. Most of this crime is due to Public Order and Domestic Abuse offences, some of which can be attributed to the high number of Mental Health Hospitals in our area. A dedicated Police Officer (PC Shaun Phillips) who has specialist experience of Mental Health problems, will now be based at Hellesdon Hospital and it is hoped this will mitigate the problems faced when patients are being discharged.

Norfolk County Council is holding a series of public consultation events between 8th May to 3th July 2018, in respect of the proposed Norwich Western Link Road, which when built could give positive benefits to residents, businesses & visitors, and support economic growth in our area. The Environmental Excellence Panel has announced the Council has been awarded £3.2m from the Warm Homes Fund, and this money will help households in 'fuel poverty'. It is estimated that there are 5000 homes in our region without central heating, and the fund will facilitate the delivery of heating systems to homes in the following three categories. Firstly, urban homes with gas central heating, secondly rural homes with 'non gas' solutions, such as air source heat pumps, oil and LPG systems, and thirdly identifying households in fuel poverty. This scheme will also cover emergency repairs, fund two employees who would undertake home visits, and assist households to access cheaper fuel.
